

TANZANIA NETWORK OF LEGAL AID PROVIDERS - (TANLAP)

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Brief introduction of TANLAP

- Tanzania Network of Legal Aid Providers (TANLAP) is an umbrella national network working in legal sector. It is a membership network comprising of Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs), Community – Based Organisations (CBOs), Faith Based Organisations (FBOs) and other institutions providing legal aid in Tanzania. Currently has 66 members and pending application for membership.
- Founded in 2006, TANLAP's core aim is to work and link up with other Civil Society Organisations in providing quality legal aid and advocate for access to justice among the poor and marginalised sections of society in Tanzania.

- TANLAP is registered as a company without shares limited by guarantee (Reg. no. 68892) and complies with the NGO Act no 24 of 2002 and is granted a certificate of compliance (No. 1300).
- TANLAP was established following realization of the need to have an independent network of legal aid providers to build the capacity of legal aid providers, to harmonize legal aid services and ethical conducts of legal aid providers and to have a collective forum for participation in policies and reforms.

Governance

- The Organization of TANLAP is geared toward ensuring that the mission and goals of the network are effectively and efficiently accomplished. In accordance with the Memorandum and Articles of Association, the members of the network meet yearly at the Annual General Meeting (AGM), which makes and takes decisions and actions on issues related to the membership, constitution and policies. The other functions of the Annual General Meeting include; approving annual reports, plans and budgets and selecting the Board of Directors and officers of the organization.
- The Board ensures the network has appropriate plans and approves quarterly, biannually and annual reports from the Executive Director. The Executive Director of TANLAP is responsible for day-to-day management of the Secretariat.

- The secretariat is responsible to the Board. Under the Executive Director, the Secretariat takes care of the operational activities by interpreting policies and strategies ensuring that activities are carried out according to plans and reports are written and submitted to relevant bodies and meetings. The Secretariat convene weekly and quarterly staff meetings and discuss issues for the overall TANLAP's organizational development and effectiveness.
- To inculcate and maintain a sense of network ownership and loyalty, TANLAP designs, implements and manages its programme using a participatory approach. The Secretariat makes deliberate effort to execute all its activities WITH and THROUGH members to avoid unnecessary competition and duplication of activities.

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Programme Beneficiaries and Geographical focus

- TANLAP provides services to member organisations and institutions across Tanzania. As the legal aid providers work with communities directly in promoting access to justice, the services of the network benefits women, poor men, Most Vulnerable Children, youths, people with disabilities, people living with HIV/AIDS and other marginalised groups.
- TANLAP plays an active role by taking part in policy and law making processes. This implies that decision makers, government leaders at various levels and other community leaders benefit from TANLAP services. In addition, educational and training institutions as well as researchers across Tanzania also comprise important beneficiaries of the network services.

Rationale for provision of Legal Aid

 LHRC Tanzania human rights report (2009), More than 80% of Tanzanians who are poor could not afford to hire private advocates to represent them in their cases. On the other hand a number of advocates enrolled in Tanzania is very small. For example as July 2013 there were around 3,000 enrolled advocates in Tanzania mainland. Proportionally, one advocate serves around 15,000 Tanzanians. According to population and Housing Census (2012) there are 44.9 million Tanzanians.



Description of existing operations at TANLAP

- TANLAP has been implementing different activities under the programme of Improving Rule of Law and Access to Justice in Tanzania since 2009 to date.
- Below are some activities that has been conducted since 2009 -2015 and the list of implementing partiners.

☐ TANLAP conducted a two days workshop on Gender Based Violence Prevention and Response

- The goal was to equip them with the necessary strategies for preventing and responding to Gender Based Violence at their work places and when attending LegaAid
- The beneficiaries were Legal Aid Providers organizations in Morogoro, Dar es Salaam and shinyanga. A total of 27 Legal Aid Providers Organizations attended.
- The facilitator capitalized on four topics which were:-Background of GBV, types of GBV, causes, consequences, combating GBV where different Laws, Instruments and Policies for GBV were shared, responses to combat GBV, Challenges on GBV Prevention and Response, GBV and the New Constitution. During the workshop Legal Aid Providers were able to share the experience on Gender Based Violence. Each organization explained how it provides legal aid services to persons affected with GBV.





- ☐ Capacity building to Mtwara based legal aid providers on the laws of a child.
- Child welfare and rights emerged to be a global challenge. In Tanzania several measures have been taken to address the predicament albeit state persisting child rights violations in our communities are continuing to be a threat. It is against this background that the network has embarked on empowering Mtwara legal aid providers and other stakeholders on the importance of promoting, respecting and upholding child rights and later to have a working relationship between LAPs and other stakeholders in the region. Participants shared and discussed child issue and further came up with strategies to move forward where each stakeholder agreed to make sure that the rights of the child are known and protected. And as the way forward after the training; participants developed a working plan to be adopted for the implementation of the training lessons.

Achievement

- ➤ TANLAP has facilitated the promotion of provision of Legal aid services in the country and enhanced relationship with the government institutions and other stakeholders. Also has actively facilitated development of a framework for promoting effective collaboration and information sharing among Legal Aid Providers in Tanzania at large. For example Key stakeholders like the judiciary, MoCLA, CHRAG linked to legal aid providers
- Increased advocacy on access to justice and improved awareness of human rights and strengthened systems of human rights monitoring .for example; Legal aid component has been included in the second draft and the proposed constitution, Vulnerable rights included in the proposed constitution and spearheaded efforts and focus toward establishment of the legal aid body and enactment of Legal Aid Act

- Increased information and awareness on the situation of the legal aid services in the country.ie statistics from the directory of legal aid providers and report of the state of legal aid services in Tanzania. Hence research, publication and documentation has been strengthened.
- Capacity of Legal Aid Providers strengthened. Different training conducted by TANLAP has increased knowledge on leadership, legal and human rights. for example skills on Leadership ,governance, ADR and the Law of Person with Disability.
- Trough provision of Legal aid ,many disputes have been solved at community level and hence promotion of peace, unity and respect for human rights in Tanzania.
- Strengthened networking and coordination has contributed to increased membership to TANLAP from 8 to 56 and other pending application

Challenges

- ▶ The absence of an enabling legal and regulatory framework; a stronger and more enabling legal and regulatory framework would lead to more systematic training and continuing legal education of service providers.
- ▶ The demand for legal aid services is steadily increasing while the capacity of LAPs and Paralegals to address them is relatively low. i. e no enough lawyers , most of LAPs are urban based, materials and equipments , and trainings on newly enacted laws.
